# Digital Post Production

## Foundation degree

All film, television, cinematic and audio visual content that we experience today has been digitally produced through editing, colour grading, enhancing, sound manipulation or special effects.

Digital post production is a fast-evolving multi-million pound industry. Professionals entering this sector need to be equipped with extensive technical, production and creative abilities. This foundation degree offers the opportunity for students to gain in-depth experience of various post production technologies, techniques and practices in a real world industry environment.

Graduates are prepared to work in the film and television post production sector.

### Areas of study

This course covers all areas relating to film and television post production in factual and fiction work such as editing, special effects, compositing and sound design. All modules integrate live industry practice, foster professionalism, reference codes of practice and standards and investigate independent and freelance modes of working.

### Course structure

Students experience a diverse mix of studio and lab work, lectures, seminars, practical workshops and training sessions, master class sessions as well as individual and group work. Students will also have an opportunity to undertake a professional work placement.

### Core modules

Modules include: Editing • Digital Media Production • 3D Animation • Sound Design • Visual Effects • 3D Compositing • Drama Production • Visual Methodologies

### Career and progression opportunities

Graduates will be equipped to enter the field of post production within the public service, commercial and independent film and broadcasting sectors.
